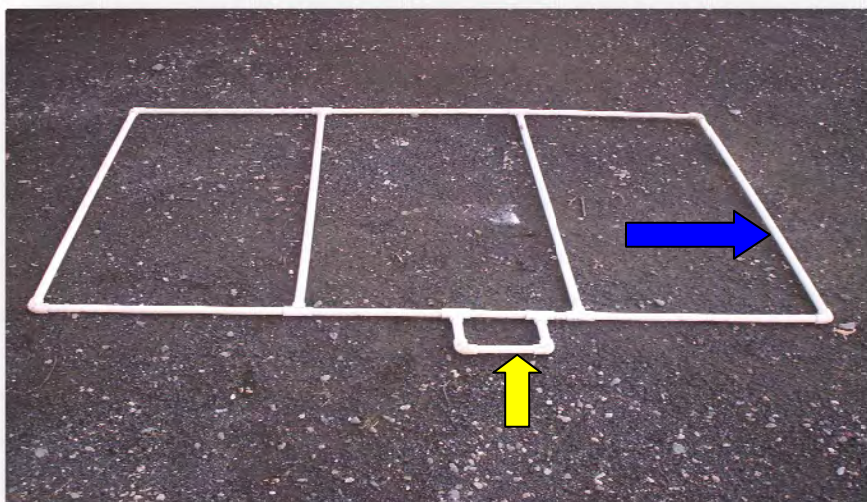


Lining the Field

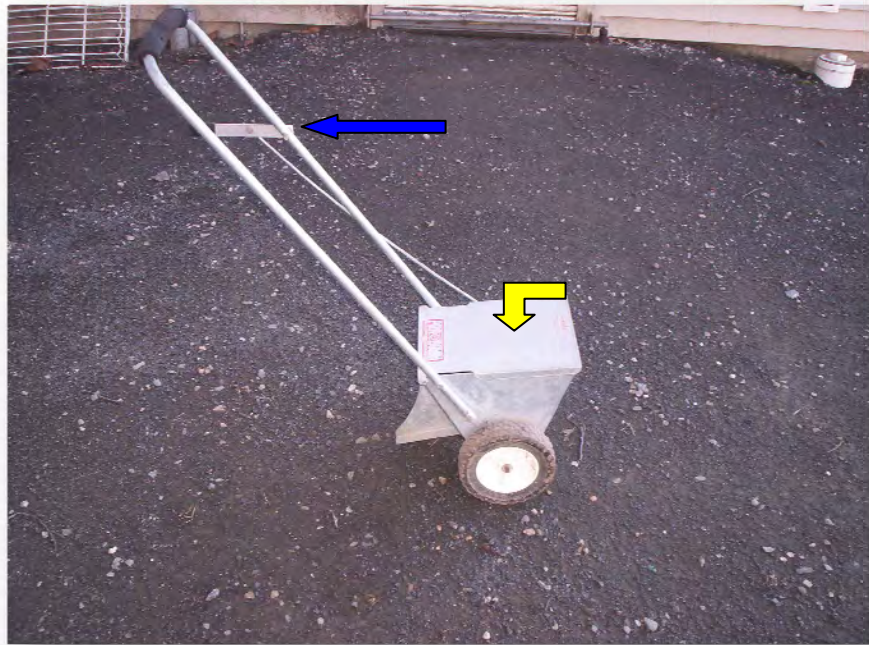


When lining the field, remember to stretch your string from the back of home plate to the outside of the base. The chalk line should go on the inside of the string.

When marking the batter's box, use the pre-made template. Put the handle next to home plate even with the square side of the plate. This will move the template 6" off the plate. This is where the box should start and if the template is turned the right way, you should have the same distance in front and behind the plate. Mark out the box with a sharp instrument, remove the template and line the box.



This is the batter's box template. The yellow arrow point to the handle and the right side (blue arrow) should go to the front side of home plate. This will give the same distance in front and behind the plate. The center pipes are for support and are not used to mark the batter's box.



This is one of our liners. You may see them with 2, 3, or the Cadillac with 4 wheels. They all work the same way. Put the marking lime in by lifting the top (yellow arrow) and dispense the lime by engaging the lever on the handle (blue arrow). When you are done, remove any unused lime or it will collect moisture and corrode the liner. Shetland and Pinto Divisions should mark top the end of the clay. All other divisions should mark to the outfield fence.
